Good housekeeping is important to an orderly and safe warehouse environment.

Truck and loading dock systems are often located at a height from the ground. Products exit and enter warehouses through these systems where employees unload and load supplies from ramps and elevated docks. Particular attention must be paid to safety practice throughout this stage. In order to avoid falls, install yellow striping along the edge of docks and ramps. Pay attention to the area all-around delivery trucks which are parked at the loading dock, especially the area between dock and the truck. Be certain that truck wheels are chocked when unloading.

To be able to distribute products in the facility, some warehouses utilize a conveyor system. These systems are made with moving wheels and belts that could pose a pinch point danger. Keep hair and body parts far away from conveyors to prevent injury. Elevated conveyors pose a hazard to employees underneath if safety nets are absent. Personnel ought to know how to stop conveyors in the event of emergency. Be aware of the location of off switches and emergency stop buttons. When servicing conveyors, lock out/tag out measures are mandatory.

To be able to make it easier to move materials, forklifts are pallet jacks are most usually utilized. The lift truck operator would require training and certification. Pallet jack operators do not need certification, but should be trained on the equipment. Training programs instruct operators in the correct methods for hoisting materials and moving them to their assigned location. Neither pallet jacks nor forklifts must ever be made use of to transport or lift staff.

To allow for adequate room for machinery and individuals to pass, rack systems and storage shelving help to create an efficient and orderly work area, specially if they are properly braced. Careful and slow placement of good is required to prevent accidents caused by products falling off the facing aisle. Aisles must be kept clear by keeping products flat and inside the shelving units. Pallets are made use of for stacking products. They must be in good condition, and palletized products must be shrink-wrapped or baled, whenever possible.

Personal protective equipment (PPE) must be worn, as appropriate, to protect workers' heads, limbs, hands and feet. Bump caps or hard hats, steel-toed shoes and gloves are common PPE.

Slippery floors that are pocked with dents and pits may present significant dangers, making good housekeeping really important. Warehouse docks and floors must be clear of dirt, debris and oil. The space must be kept clear of trash, boxes and baling materials.
