Workers in this business are usually trained through a formal apprenticeship course offered by unions or companies or else with on-the-job training. Some technical and trade schools offer paid training programs. It is vital that employers hire fully-trained heavy equipment operators to be able to follow local rules and comply with local and regional laws regarding employee safety and job situations.
